STOP THE MASTS

Make sure you get your objections in **now**







467 people objected to a mast proposal off Fulham Palace Road last year and it was stopped.

A developer is proposing to put **mobile phone masts** and other clutter onto the roof of Cobbs Hall on Fulham Palace Rd. (At least 18 transmitters in total, but concealed behind new rooftop screens).

Did anyone from the Council let you know? The most basic display of a Site Notice - to let the nearest residents know about the consultation — was only seen **after** we started leafleting to alert the public.

- It would make the building skyline look distorted and bulky. It would look totally out of place for the Crabtree conservation area.
- Several homes, a number of schools and nurseries, and the Lillie Road recreation ground are in range of the proposed masts. This is important as young people's bodies are still developing and they are more vulnerable to mast radiation effects. A Chief Medical Officer has called for minimising their exposure.

Yet the proposer did not feel any local schools were worth consulting!

• Trees and other greenery within range would suffer the harmful effects of radiation. They are a key part of the character of the area and provide environmental benefits.
